Chemours Statement

Chemours is currently reviewing the notice of violation from the state, and will respond accordingly to their outlined request for information. The system installed to capture and treat water from the stream referred to as Old Outfall 002 began operation in October 2020, and has experienced unordinary stresses, including excessive solids, since that time due to above average rainfall. Chemours has already incorporated additional mitigation measures as a result of our learnings, and we are moving forward with treatment of the 002 stream, as well as addressing PFAS loading to the Cape Fear River, as approved by the state as part of our Consent Order and Consent Order Addendum. Chemours has demonstrated a commitment to environmental stewardship that is significant and meaningful, and we have already taken numerous actions to control PFAS emissions at our Fayetteville site. We are not aware of any other company in our industry or other industries who has taken the steps we have taken.
